Nomination of Candidates to Serve on the Council of Robben Island Museum

In terms of the Cultural Institutions Act, 1998 (Act No. 119 of 1998), members of the heritage fraternity and the general public are hereby invited to nominate persons to serve as Council members of Robben Island Museum.

When nominations are submitted, it should be borne in mind that the nominee requires a broad understanding of and experience in the field of heritage, broad managerial and financial expertise, legal expertise, knowledge of marketing and liaison, fundraising, education and cultural/social research, as well as willingness to render community service.

Anyone wishing to nominate persons to serve as members of Council of the Robben Island Museum should submit the following:

- A letter containing full names and all contact details of the nominee. The letter must also provide reasons for nomination and explain suitability for appointment
- Recently updated Curriculum Vitae of the nominee, including three (3) contactable references
- A statement/letter signed by the nominee, in which he or she agrees to the nomination.

No nomination will be considered unless all of the above are included. Correspondence will only be entered into with short-listed candidates.
